

RABBI GOES ON COLLEGE BOARD

Rabbi Moses J. Gries of The Temple, E. 55th-st and Central-av S. E., was elected Sunday morning to a vacancy on the board of governors of Hebrew Union college, in Cincinnati, O.

Rabbi Gries, who lives at 2045 E. 93d-st, graduated from Hebrew Union college twenty-three years ago. He then went to Chattanooga, Tenn., where he held his first charge for three years. From Chattanooga he came to Cleveland twenty years ago, and has lived and worked here ever since.

The college, devoted exclusively to theology, was founded about thirty-five years ago by Dr. Isaac Meyer Wise of Cincinnati, a pioneer in the Jewish reform movement in the United States. He founded the college to carry out his views and became its first president. Upon his death he was succeeded by Dr. Kaufman Kohler.

During the past few years the college raised a large endowment fund, and at present is erecting a number of new buildings. From an architectural standpoint these buildings are said to be finer than those of any college in the country.
