RABBI GRIES DELEGATED. Chosen for Work of Organising Jewish Chautauque in Contral Western States.

Rabbi Moses J. Gries was authorized yesterday by the executive committee of the Jewish Chautauqua society at Philadelphia to organize a similar assembly in the west.

At the present time there is but one such assembly in the United States and the need of another has been felt for some time. The present one is held at Atlantic City each year and at the last

meeting Rabbi Gries championed the idea of another assembly, especially for the central western states. The appointment of Rabbi Gries followed naturally and he will direct the organization.

The next step in the big plan, which is still in a somewhat ombryonic state, will be the appointment of a committee to select a suitable location.

Rabbi Gries said last night that the idea is to find a place at some point in Michigan that will be accessible from all

Michigan that will be accessible from all big cities along the lakes and in Illinois, Wisconsin, Michigan and Ohio, including Cleveland and Cincinnati, A number of Michigan cities will be considered and fi

will be several weeks before a decision is reached after the site is settled upon.
