

MAY BURY CHRISTIANS IN JEWISH CEMETERIES

Rabbi Moses J. Gries Elected
President of Central Conference

(By Associated Press.)

DETROIT, July 8.—The central conference of American rabbis at the closing session here yesterday authorized the appointment of a committee which will endeavor to harmonize the civil law of the states with the Mosaic law relating to marriage and divorce.

The discussion of the subject made it plain that the organization would not countenance violation of the civil law even where it conflicted with the Mosaic law.

It was also decided by the conference that Christians may be buried in Jewish cemeteries if there is no sectarian service at the grave and no Christian symbols on the monument.

All the present officers were re-elected as follows: President, Rabbi Moses J. Gries, Cleveland; vice-president, Rabbi William Rosenau, Baltimore; treasurer, Rabbi Leo M. Franklin, Detroit; recording secretary, Rabbi Morris M. Feuerlicht, Indianapolis; corresponding secretary, Rabbi Joseph S. Kornfeld, Columbus.
