

"SERMONS by American Rabbis" is the title of a volume of 370 pages octavo, English style, published by the publication committee of the Central Conference of American Rabbis. This volume contains sermons for all seasons and holy days, for reading in synagogues which are without a preacher, as well as for reading in the family devotions. Contents and diction are above the ordinary and high above vulgar bigotry. The collection makes a fair showing of the talent in the American pulpit in the temple, although, of course, there is no logical connection or system in the sermons joined together by chance, yet there are a good many congenial ideas well expressed in this volume.
